Employment criteria

- Complete the Aged Care Job Skills program
- Ability to get to and from work
- Available to work a minimum of 7.6 hours per week (school based) OR
- Available to work a minimum of 15 hours per week (part time)
- Motivation to complete the Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing) and your SACE
- Successful completion of a National Police Clearance and NDIS check (this is not funded through the Job Skills program, please talk to your VET Coordinator about how these costs might be covered)
- Up to date COVID vaccinations

Process

- 1. Express your interest by sending your resume, cover letter and candidate details form
- 2. Complete an interview with ACA
- 3. Advice provided regarding your acceptance into the Job Skills program
- 4. Complete Equals International enrolment paperwork
- 5. Commence Job Skills program Monday 22nd July 2024 (see program schedule)
- 6. Complete Job Skills program 27th September 2024 (including 1 week's work experience)
- 7. Undertake merit-based selection process with ACA and host employer
- 8. If successful, negotiate school-based traineeship with school
- 9. Commence school based traineeship

^{**10} positions in the Job Skills program have been secured for Thebarton Senior College students. There is up to a further 10 positions available in the program. All students will be assessed through a merit-based selection process to determine suitability for the traineeship opportunities.
