Governing Council Report

As we reflect on the 2024 school year, it's clear that Open Access College (OAC) has continued to foster a supportive, inclusive, and dynamic environment for our students and families. The school's core values of Respect, Resilience, Responsibility, and Inclusion have been at the heart of every initiative. Through events like Wellbeing Week, where students participated in a range of engaging activities from African drumming to Escape Room challenges, we not only celebrated the sense of belonging but also promoted students' emotional and physical wellbeing. This year, we were thrilled to witness the enthusiasm and creativity of our community as students embraced opportunities to learn, grow, and connect with one another. The emphasis on inclusion ensured that all students, regardless of background or ability, felt seen, heard, and valued.

Throughout the year, there have been several opportunities for our students to expand their horizons, both academically and personally. Highlights included the inspiring STEM Aboriginal Learners Congress, which celebrated the rich cultural knowledge of Aboriginal communities, and the Year 10 students' poetic explorations that gave them a voice to address issues they care about. Our students also showcased their creativity through unique projects like the upcycled fashion designs, where Year 9-10 students transformed old garments into fresh, innovative pieces. These experiences reflect the essence of OAC—empowering students to embrace their individuality while learning from and contributing to the broader community.

This year also saw significant changes that helped improve the educational experience for our students. The transition to Microsoft Teams for lessons and the increase in lesson frequency from one to two per week have already shown promising results, providing greater consistency and enhancing student engagement. Furthermore, the official opening of our upgraded Teaching Facility and Indigenous Garden marked a proud milestone for OAC. We are deeply grateful to our students, staff, and community members for their ongoing support, and we look forward to further embracing the values of respect, resilience, responsibility and inclusion as we continue to evolve and grow together.

Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or nongovernment school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
