# Message from the Head of Campus

SOTA students continue to strive for excellence, always working towards being the best version of themselves. Maintaining high expectations, holding ourselves and each other accountable, and taking personal responsibility are key values that create a strong foundation for our learning community.

We are committed to making SOTA an inclusive learning environment for all. During a recent visit to the Year 5/6 classroom, students were discussing the legacy they want to leave behind. One comment from Eli R really resonated with me—he shared that SOTA does not have bullying, and that our students genuinely get along. He's right. For the majority of the time, our learning and social culture is rich with care and kindness, and it is important that we all work together to maintain this.

I encourage everyone—students, teachers, families, and supervisors—to continue conversations about the behaviours we want to see and model, including:

- Staying focused on learning
- Keeping hands and feet to ourselves
- Raising hands to speak
- Listening to our friends
- Respecting personal space
- Not talking while others are speaking

Our teachers will continue reinforcing behaviour expectations, and your support in these discussions at home and during school events is greatly appreciated.

**Miss Morley: George:** For a proactive approach to his online learning throughout this term and excellent participation in class activities this week.


Mrs Wright: Aria: for going above and beyond when doing crayon resist and helping others learn the skill with kindness and compassion.






















# Mr Moyne's Itinerant Visits








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# **Miss Stringer - Reception**




